Edmonton
Elected 1984

The artist was introduced to the medium of watercolour painting by the noted painter Robert Hurley. Painting in earnest since 1951 Mel Heath has had his work purchased by many major corporate and private collections both at home and abroad. Exhibiting widely his work has been extensively reproduced in books and calendars.

BETTY SCALE HENDRIE

Hamilton
Elected 1971

Studied at the Farnham School of Art in England and Canada's Dundas Valley School. Exhibiting widely since 1960 the artist has been the recipient of several major awards including the Gold Medal for Watercolours - Paris Salon and the Diplôme d'Honneur - International Salon Biarritz. The subject of a one-woman show at the Art Gallery of Hamilton her work is represented in major collections around the world.

BARBARA ROE HICKLIN

Calgary
Elected 1980

Since 1958 she has been an active member of the Alberta Society of Artists. She has held numerous solo exhibitions and has participated in many major group shows. Her work is represented in collections across Canada.

MARJORIE J. HODGSON

Scarborough
Elected 1974

Educated at the Doon School of Fine Art and the Ontario College of Art her career has included book illustration and art instruction. A regular contributor to C.S.P.W.C. exhibitions she has also had several successful solo shows.

SHARON HOLMES

Calgary
Elected 1980

A native of Stettler, Alberta the artist was educated at the University of Calgary and the Alberta College of Art. An active participant in the western art communities the artist has exhibited throughout Canada, the U.S.A. and in Japan. Two recent extended painting sojourns were spent in Boulder, Colorado and in Whistler, British Columbia. The book 'Prairie Remedies' was illustrated with this artist's work. Her paintings are in numerous national corporate collections.

JANE HUNTER

Sarnia
Elected 1978

A graduate of the Ontario College of Art she trained as an art educator. She has been the recipient of several Ontario Arts Council grants for "Creative Artists in the Schools" programs. Over the last decade she has exhibited widely in group and solo shows and was recently selected to represent her city in the "Suncor Crossroads" series of paintings.
